THE SERVICE OF THE WORD

Please be seated.

FIRST LESSON

A reading from the Hebrew Testament and the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.

But there will be no gloom for those who were in anguish. In the former time God brought into contempt the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the latter time God will make glorious the way of the sea, the land beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the nations.

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness - on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian.

PAUSE

Reader: Listen for the leading of the Spirit.

All: Thanks be to God.

PSALM

The psalm is printed in the bulletin. Let us read responsively.

The Holy One is my light and my salvation; whom then shall I fear? The Holy One is the strength of my life; of whom then shall I be afraid?

One thing have I asked of the Most High; one thing I seek; that I may dwell in the house of the Holy One all the days of my life,

Beholding the fair beauty of the Holy One and seeking God in the temple.

For in the day of trouble, O God, you shall keep me safe in your shelter; you shall hide me in the secrecy of your dwelling and set me high upon a rock.

Even now you lift up my head above my enemies round about me.

Therefore I will offer in your dwelling an oblation with sounds of great gladness; I will sing and make music to the Holy One.

Hearken to my voice, O God, when I call; have mercy on me and answer me.

You speak in my heart and say, "Seek my face." Your face, O God, will I seek.

Hide not your face from me, nor turn away your servant in displeasure.

You have been my helper; cast me not away; do not forsake me, O God of my salvation.

SECOND READING

A reading from a letter of Paul to the church in Corinth.

Now I appeal to you, brothers, sisters and siblings, by the name of our Saviour Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters.

What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name.

(I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

THE GOSPEL

Gospeller: May God be with you.

All: And also with you.

Gospeller: The Gospel of Jesus the Christ, according to Mathew.

All: Glory to you, Jesus the Christ.

Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles - the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the realm of heaven has come near."

As Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea - they fished by trade. Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people." Immediately they left their nets and began to follow Jesus.

Jesus walked along further and saw two other brothers, James and John, ben-Zebedee. They were in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. Jesus called them and immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed Jesus.

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the realm of heaven and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

Supplementary Eucharistic Prayer 1

Celebrant: May God be with you.

All: And also with you.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up to God.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to God our Creator.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant: Holy God, Lover of creation, we give you thanks and praise for in

the ocean of your steadfast love you bear us and place the song of your Spirit in our hearts. When we turn from your love and defile the earth, you do not abandon us. Your Spirit speaks through Huldah and Micah, through prophets, sages, and saints

in every age, to confront our sin and reveal the vision of your new creation. Joining in the song of the universe we proclaim

your glory saying:

All: Holy, Holy, Holy, O God of hosts.

Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blest is the One who comes in the name of our God.

Hosanna, hosanna in the highest.

Celebrant: Gracious God, in the fullness of time you sent Jesus the Christ to

share our fragile humanity. Through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection you open the path from brokenness to health, from

fear to trust, from pride and conceit to reverence for you.

Rejected by a world that could not bear the Gospel of life, Jesus
