This Week on the Spiritual Path

Any spiritual path involves practice and preparation. Practice makes the path more satisfying and meaningful, whether it is yoga, or Buddha, or **Jesus**! How do we practice? We live the values of the Christian life. We cultivate our relationship with God. We worship together, and we *prepare ourselves* to 'meet God' in worship. Here are my suggestions for this *your practice* this week.

1. **Read:** Sunday readings in advance: Isaiah 62:1-5; Psalm 36:5-10; 1 **Corinthians 12:1-11**; John 2:1-11. What are the main ideas that seem important to you? Predict: What will the sermon be about? (Gary is preaching at 8:30 and the Primate is preaching at 10:30).

2. **Think:** Consider your gifts, your abilities...the ones *other people* in your life say you do particularly well. These may or may not be the gifts you care about most, but they are the ones that seem to shine through readily these days. You may even exercise these gifts without thinking about them very much! Think about these gifts. (You already give enough time to the ones you wish to have...)

3. **Pray:** "Bring my attention to the person who would most appreciate this gift today..."

4. **Act:** Do your thing! For the person who needs it.. for the delight of being able to do it... And afterwards: Who benefits when I do this?

Worshipping as a community is a very important! You will get more out of it, and have more to give of yourself if you work at your practice of the Christian Life.
