SUNDAY WILL MARK SPECIAL OPENING ESTABLISHED FORTY-TWO YEARS AGO

Splendid Advancement Made Since 1881 When Little Parish Was First Established at the Corner of St. John's Road and Dundas Street

Forty-two years ago, St. John's Church was opened in its old position at the corner of St. John's Rd. and Dundas St. under the rectorship of the Rev. Arthur Miles. The work was begun and flourished for many years with Rev. R. P. McKim, Archbishop DuVerne, Rev. Beverly Smith in charge. Then came the rapid growth of the district, and it was generally felt that the Church was in the wrong place for the most advantageous work. The result of this feeling is the new edifice which has been erected to the glory of God at Quebec and Humber-side Aves., under the Rev. R. Mac-Namara. The corner stone was laid on May 5th last. It has taken much

labor and many great sacrifices, but it will be the centre of a glorious field of activity now and in years to come.

Sunday morning, Nov. 4th, the Church will be opened by the Bishop of Toronto, who will preach, and in the evening the Rev. Dr. Dyson Hague, of the Church of the Epiphany, will preach. The choir will render appropriate music for the occasion and will be assisted by several well-known artists. These special services will be continued for the month of November.
